A human being can be trafficked inside a country or across borders. In turn, border control - with its systematic checks - has a unique role and ability to intervene, prevent and combat trafficking in human beings. EU Member States have an obligation to establish appropriate mechanisms aimed at early identification, assistance and support for victims of trafficking in human beings. It is recommended that Member States accomplish this task in cooperation with relevant support organisations. As border control can play a crucial role in identifying potential and actual victims of trafficking, FRONTEX aims, with this manual, to support the Member States in fulfilling this challenging task.
